### About the College

#### A Transformative Education

The ampersand in the middle of the College's name, meaning "both/and," emphasizes the purpose and power of F&M's liberal arts model. At F&M, relationships—among disciplines and ideas, and among the students, faculty, and staff who explore them—are at the core of the College's mission and academic enterprise. Working side-by-side, the community pushes boundaries and examines the relationship between theory and practice. This interdisciplinary approach equips students with the critical thinking skills, creativity, and sense of responsibility needed to confront the complex issues of today's world. With 52 fields of study spanning the breadth of traditional and modern disciplines, F&M continues to expand the academic curriculum with distinctive interdisciplinary subjects, including scientific and philosophical studies of mind; business, organizations and society; public health; data science; Latin American studies; entrepreneurship; and an array of new certificate programs and degree partnerships.

F&M's distinguished faculty set the example for groundbreaking scholarship, earning numerous national and international honors, including prestigious grants, fellowships, and career awards from esteemed professional organizations. One of F&M's defining features is the prominence of <u>faculty-student research and experiential learning</u>. Nearly two-thirds of students engage in one-on-one research projects with faculty members, allowing them to contribute to the creation and publication of new knowledge and expand their academic horizons. Whether <u>researching nucleic acids alongside their faculty mentor, teaching philosophy at the local high school as an internship-for-credit, or evaluating the quantitative and qualitative dimensions of social justice in <u>Lancaster</u>, F&M students develop intellectual skills and have real-life experiences that set them on an extraordinary trajectory.</u>

The College's <u>Center for Career and Professional Development</u> cultivates experiences that embolden students and alumni to design and navigate fulfilling careers with courage and curiosity. Offering countless programs, workshops, and opportunities for students beginning in their first year of college and continuing after graduation, F&M's career center prides itself on supporting students and alumni at every stage of their journey.

#### A Distinctive Student Experience

A signature component of the living and learning experience at F&M is the <u>College House residential</u> <u>community</u>. All first-year students are assigned to one of five college houses and remain affiliated with their House for life. Each House is led by a senior member of the faculty (House Don) and an experienced student-life professional (House Dean), as well as a unique student government. This enables each House to serve as a hub for intellectual, social, and cultural engagement where students grow together.

Student growth and success is supported holistically by engaging students at every level—academic, personal, emotional, and physical. Students participate in more than 100 active <u>student clubs and organizations</u>, including Greek life and dozens of clubs and intramural sports teams. F&M Diplomats compete athletically in Division III of the NCAA, <u>sponsoring 28 varsity teams as well as five intramural sports and numerous club sports</u>. The Diplomats also compete at the NCAA Division I level in wrestling while additionally sponsoring both men's and

women's rowing and squash at the varsity level. F&M plays in the Centennial Conference, an elite group of liberal arts colleges that maintain <u>exceptional academic standards</u> while also competing in athletics at a highly successful level.

The College is dedicated to fostering an environment where every person feels valued, respected, and integral to the fabric of the community. For the third year in a row, the College has received the Higher Education Excellence in Diversity (HEED) Award in recognition of an outstanding commitment to diversity and inclusion. The community has also embraced its shared identity as Diplomats by championing free expression and constructive dialogue, believing that an F&M education is not just about classroom learning, but also preparation to handle real-world challenges with creativity, intellect and empathy.

#### A Local & Global Community

At F&M, one does not have to travel far for vibrant cultural and global experiences. They are right on campus and in the dynamic <u>City of Lancaster</u>. A city of 60,000 residents in a surrounding region of over 500,000, Lancaster is both a bustling urban center and a close-knit community within walking distance of campus. Its rich history and cultural diversity are evident in its thriving arts scene, historic architecture, and <u>"a global feast in an unlikely spot"</u> (*The New York Times*).

No matter where you turn, Lancaster offers extraordinary opportunities for a liberal arts education. Five hundred and fifty students participate in local research, internships, and service projects in both the city and county each year, and more than 100 businesses, nonprofits, organizations, and schools partner with F&M to create meaningful off-campus opportunities for students and faculty. Every semester, multiple course offerings provide hands-on experiences in the city and surrounding region that directly serve the community in meaningful ways. The combination of local engagement and global awareness prepares F&M students to navigate a complex, interconnected world with compassion, creativity, and clarity of purpose.

In addition to opportunities on campus and in Lancaster, students acquire intercultural knowledge and, in some cases, intensive language immersion, through more than 170 approved off-campus study programs. The College owns the Advanced Studies in England (ASE) program based in Bath, England, and in recent years, has begun to offer a transformative program for first-years called "iF&M," in which a small group of students get to start their F&M education with a 16-week intellectual experience in England. In addition, for the seventh consecutive year, the Fulbright U.S. Student Program has named F&M a top-producing institution.

F&M's global reach extends through the College's nearly 30,000 alumni, living and working in all 50 states and more than 70 countries. The tremendous success of F&M graduates demonstrates the lasting value of an F&M education when compared with national outcomes. The mission of the Franklin & Marshall College Alumni Association is to advance the welfare of the College and its alumni by engaging alumni in the life of their alma mater; fostering and strengthening the connections between and among alumni, students, and the rest of the college community; and inspiring in alumni and students a lifelong sense of loyalty toward, pride in, and support of, the College.

The support of F&M alumni and friends is most evident in the successful conclusion of <a href="the-largest campaign">the-largest campaign</a> in <a href="#F&M history">F&M history</a>, Now to Next</a>, which raised \$220 million, surpassing its goal of \$200 million. Other fundraising initiatives include <a href="#F&M Women & Philanthropy: 50 for 50">F&M Women & Philanthropy: 50 for 50</a>, the <a href="Raise Our Game annual campaign">Raise Our Game annual campaign</a> for Diplomat Athletics, and the College's annual Day of Giving, ensuring F&M can continue to foster life-changing moments and opportunities for future generations.
